 The installation, on a significant scale, of indirect/direct fluorescent fixtures in a science abstract company's headquarters signals renewed interest in the approach.

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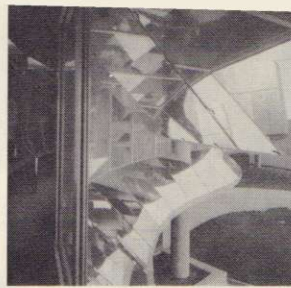
